## <u>COST</u>

#### For Medical Appointments:

- \$3.00 co-payment EACH WAY (\$6.00 Round Trip)
- If you have Title 19 Medical Assistance and your doctor approves the ride, Title 19 may cover all but \$1.00 of the cost for medical rides you should contact a ride service that accepts medical assistance (T-19) for rides.

Contributions are accepted for rides to other locations. NO Tipping Please.

## **IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

It takes ONE WEEK after you receive your RIDER ID Card in the mail before you can schedule your first ride.

If you have an urgent need to ride before that time, call the Aging Resource Center at (414) 289-6874 so your information can be faxed to the ride service provider.

### **DRIVERS WILL:**

- Escort passengers to and from the vehicle
- Assist passengers getting in and out of the vehicle
- Help with seatbelts
- Help load shopping bags into the vehicle
- Help carry shopping bags/items thru the first door only of the home or apartment building
